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### Message from the Chair of Governors

Dear Parents,

I would like to take this opportunity to present Y Bont Faen Primary School's Annual Report to Parents for the academic year 2018 - 19. The purpose of the Report is to offer a review of the work of the school and governors over the past academic year and provide an insight into future plans.

We said goodbye to Mr Couldrick and Mrs Cooper who both left the school in August 2019. The senior management team of Julia Adams, Mrs Mel Hayman and Mr Graeme Jones was supplemented by Mrs Rebecca Millard.

We also saw the retirement of several governors who had given freely of their time and skills over many years, and we are very grateful to Helen Harbour, Geraint Couldrick and Alison Watt for their support and commitment. Following parent elections and co options new governors including; David Baker, Flora Phillips and Sian Roberts joined the governing body during the year. The full list of current governors can be seen below in the report.

The academic results for the school are verified externally through a process of moderation, and a summary of these is included at the back of this report. The end of KS2 results reflect the achievements of the cohort of pupils that have now moved on to the High School. We are pleased to report that the targets we set in the previous academic year were met or surpassed. All pupils achieved the national expected outcomes at the end of KS2 and 74% achieved a level higher than the national expectation.

The school once again was placed in the top categories for children's reading and numeracy results in the National Tests and overall, we were pleased with the progress made by our pupils in the end of year Teacher Assessments. Further data and information is available towards the end of this report.

The school collaborates closely with the Challenge Adviser from the Central South Consortium who visits the school regularly to scrutinise work, verify data, and review end of phase/key stage outcomes. He also observes and reports on the teaching and standards in general.

Despite our end of year results showing that we would be a category one for achievement the governors, in consultation with our Challenge Adviser, decided that we would remain in the same support category as last year to ensure continued support. This means that we are placed in band yellow which reflects the level of support we will receive from the LA.

The governors would like to thank the PTA for their sterling work in raising funds and supporting the school generally. Last year saw the PTA contribute a substantial amount of money which enabled the school to purchase extra resources. This can be seen in the report from Karen Frost the PTA treasurer.

We were also pleased to see the links forged with the students studying for the Welsh Baccalaureate at Cowbridge High School, the local Rotary Group, the Fire Service and with the local police. We have been very fortunate to have excellent community links with people visiting the school and pupils taking part in different activities in the community. We are very grateful to all the individuals who give of their time freely to support our pupils.

It is also pleasing to report that a defibrillator has been installed at the school and is available for community use.

Unfortunately, during the year more damage from flooding occurred during the Christmas break and thankfully Mrs Adams and her team of helpers managed to salvage quite a lot of equipment. If it wasn't for their prompt and effective action during the holiday period, we doubt if the school would have re-opened for the start of the new term. For this we are immensely grateful.

With a great deal going on in the background with regard to proposals to reorganise primary provision in Cowbridge by the Local Authority, there are a few uncertainties to consider. We look forward however, to working together to ensure a positive and successful 2019/20 academic year.

**Healthy eating.** The development of healthy lifestyles is a high priority for our school. Y Bont Faen promotes healthy eating. A fruit snack is provided for Foundation Phase nursery children. Pupils have access to drinking water throughout the day. Healthy School Council promotes healthy eating.

### Safeguarding.

The safeguarding and wellbeing of pupils is of paramount importance to us. The school has a comprehensive Safeguarding Policy and all staff receive training in Child Protection and Critical Incidents Management.

The children take part in a range of activities to ensure that they feel safe, and staff and governors receive annual Child Protection training. We have a comprehensive PSHE curriculum addressed through class sessions, assemblies and circle times. In surveys children report that they feel happy and safe at y Bont Faen Primary. The school has robust safeguarding and child protection procedures including safe recruitment. The designated Safeguarding Officer is Mrs Julia Adams and the deputy officers are Mrs Mel Hayman, Miss Jackie Jones and Mrs Eileen Miller and the governor is Mrs Carolyn Lyons.

The school provides wrap around care with the Breakfast Club and After-School Club. The Breakfast Club is free due to funding from the Welsh Government, however After-School Club is independent and sessions are charged for.

### **Toilets**

All toilets have been refurbished to a high standard. The school provides sufficient toilets for the number of pupils on roll. These toilets are cleaned on a daily basis.

Monday 2 September 2019 and Monday 20 July 2020 will be designated Inset Days for the academic year 2019-2020. Monday 6 January and Monday 27 January have been chosen as Inset Days too.

### **Targets**

- Governors have worked with the Headteacher to set targets for the forthcoming three years. The process of agreeing targets is based on the following principles: -
- Targets should be challenging, realistic and manageable;
- They should be school specific, reflecting an informed evaluation of each year group of children;
- In order to be meaningful, some targets should be considered over a time span of more than one year;
- Class teachers have a crucial role to play in the setting of targets and are fully involved in the process.

In line with these principles, teachers use the wide range of information they have about each child in their class to set an individual target level in national curriculum tasks and tests. This is a whole-school initiative and teachers work hard to ensure that each individual target is challenging, but realistic. These individual targets are collated to form aggregate targets for each year group. The

targets were set in the Autumn Term 2018, and subsequently agreed by the Consortium. These targets are reviewed and agreed annually.

### Welsh.

English is the main language of the school however; Welsh is taught throughout the school and the language is used naturally and included on signs and documents. The school takes a full and active part in Welsh cultural events and has good working relations with our neighbouring Welsh medium school.

### **SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PRIORITIES for 2019-20**

Each academic year, the Head Teacher and her staff produce a School Improvement Plan. This important document represents the vision for improvement in the form of targets and actions and ensures a commitment to raise achievement in all areas of school life.

### **Priority 1**

Improve outcomes for boys' and girls' literacy at the higher levels throughout the Foundation Phase and KS2.

### **Priority 2**

Raise awareness of Donaldson Curriculum and implement Digital Competency.

### **Priority 3**

Ensure that all teachers use appropriate assessment strategies and provide pupils with useful written feedback on how to improve their learning.

### **Priority 4**

Raise expectations and provide learning experiences that challenge all pupils at an appropriate level.

### **Priority 5**

Ensure that senior leaders carry out their strategic roles fully and tackle under-performance robustly.

### **Priority 6**

To continue to introduce, plan for and implement Foundation Phase and KS2 areas of learning and Programmes of Study for language and maths.

### **Additional Learning Needs**

The school employs an Additional Learning Needs Co-ordinator and an ALN LSA. Responsibilities include co-ordinating provision for Additional Learning Needs (ALN).

The named Governor for Additional Learning Needs is Carolyn Lyons. She has met with the ALNCo regularly throughout the year. A report to Governors regarding details of Additional Learning Needs provision is delivered to Governors at least once every term.

A copy of the school's ALN policy can be seen on request to the Head Teacher and is accessible through the school website. The objectives of the policy are to provide equal access to the curriculum for all children.

There are currently 19 children (out of 266, 7.14%) on the Additional Learning Needs register. Of these, 12 children are identified as School Action and 5 as School Action+. Three children received Free School Meals (FSM).

### **Donations and fundraising**

### Report from PTA for 2018/2019

Total funds donated to the school during the year were £4,393 (2017/18: £3,629).

Our main purchase was renewing outdoor play equipment (£1051) for both KS1 and KS2 to enhance lunchtime play. The PTA worked with staff to identify the play equipment required which included basics such as skipping ropes, balls, skaters, spinning tops and a bounce mat.

Other funds went towards the purchase of netball kit and equipment; ALN learning materials; books for the school library; funding a visit from an author; the purchase of a much-needed vacuum cleaner for the school cleaner; and tools for our caretaker.

Monies from our running track fund were used to purchase an outdoor cabinet for the defibrillator (purchased last year), gazebos for use on Sports Day and line marking equipment. The planned training on the use of the defibrillator was also delivered to staff, children and parents.

In addition to the annual Spooky Disco, Christmas Cards, Christmas Fayre, Christmas Hampers, Sports Day and Duck Race Fundraising, an Art Exhibition and sale was held which show cased the exceptional talent of the children whilst raising valuable funds. We also experimented with individual classes hosting a series of bake sales (£489) throughout

the year and had the children design and sell their own unique Father's Day gifts (£321). Each of these additional events was in response to ideas from new parents and we would like to encourage other parents to help us to continue to explore other fundraising avenues.

The PTA has also agreed to fund twelve iPads and an interactive whiteboard (approx. £4500) to increase the opportunities for all children in the school to participate in online learning and further the development of their digital skills in accordance with the Digital Competence Framework and to facilitate access to online numeracy testing. The new IT equipment was ordered by the end of the 2018/19 school year, ready to roll out during the new academic year. Therefore the invoices will be processed and expenditure recognised in the 2019/20 accounts.

We would also like to express our gratitude for the continuing support from the local estate agency, HRT. During the course of the year they provided prizes to the winners of the Easter Egg decorating and egg rolling competitions; and to the winners of the Christmas Card design competition; provided mulled wine & mince pies at our Art Gallery evening and purchased a new shed for the infant (KS1) play ground to store play equipment.

Most importantly we must thank all the parents who have helped deliver events, donated, baked and shopped! Without your support we couldn't achieve our objectives of raising funds for the benefit of all our children. We also must thank the parents and extended family members who have throughout the year stepped up to the challenge by undertaking their own fundraising, including Dads who found the time to cycle across Wales; go sky diving and those who have shared their skills and time to help paint and undertake essential grounds maintenance at school. Your hard work is much appreciated and applauded!

### Goals for 2019/20

Following consultation with teaching staff, the primary goals for this academic year include:

- Upgrade the whiteboard / projector facilities for each classroom. With age, these have become unreliable and of poor quality.
- Purchase a new PA system for use at school events including Sports Day.

We would also like to continue to support after school clubs and improve playground facilities.

Planned events to raise funds to support these goals include: Spooky Disco, Bath Christmas Market Trip, Christmas Fayre, Christmas Hamper Raffle (during the Christmas Concerts), Sports Day Refreshments, Duck Race, and a 5p Challenge with the possibility of additional Easter themed events if sufficient support is forthcoming.

To be able to achieve success for the school we need to continue to build on the support the parents gave to us during the last academic year. This will remain an underlying goal for the ongoing success of the Y Bont Faen Parent Teacher Association.
