

Year 2 Home Learning Activities - 20/4/20

Literacy Activities - New topic is Wriggle and Crawl!	Numeracy Activities - Continue to work on the skills in bold .
<p>Handwriting Continue to write in independent writing books. Focus on keeping handwriting consistent in size and shape - Practice this by writing out a paragraph from your favourite book using different colours for each sentence.</p>	<p>Counting Count in 2's, 5's and 10's to 100, forwards and backwards from any number (Challenge - count beyond 100) Practice writing these as sums ($2 \times 2 = 4$). You could make a bookmark/poster for each one to help you.</p> <p>Add and subtract 10/20 from any number to 100.</p> <p>Read and write numbers to 100.</p>
<p>Key word recognition games</p> <p>Topmarks key word games.</p> <p>Read a new book, write down any new words you come across, find the meaning of them in a dictionary and try and spell them correctly.</p> <p>SPLAT! - Write a list of key words you find tricky to read/spell. Cut them out and stick them in the garden/on a wall. Ask an adult to shout out a word and SPLAT the correct word. Laminate these and use a water gun/nerf gun for more fun!</p>	<p>Number Use a dice to roll 2/3 numbers, add these together and write the answer as a sum.</p> <p>Read and write number words to 100.</p> <p>Practice place value (hundreds, tens, units) - play game on Topmarks (place value basketball) then try some on your own.</p> <p>Gather 10 toys/objects in your house and make a line - can you say what position they are? E.g. first, second etc. Try writing these words.</p>
<p>Writing Go on a mini beast hunt in your local area/garden (Don't forget to take pictures) with an adult. After your hunt, create a guidebook for other children. Include a list of equipment needed and how to use it, some mini beasts that you might find and include pictures of what they look like, what to wear and a glossary. Design a front cover and give it a title. Use a dictionary to check spellings (online dictionaries are useful if you don't have one).</p> <p>Create a list of do's and don'ts for a successful mini beast hunt (do some research if you need to - woodland trust has some good information).</p> <p>Following your reading activity below, write a set of instructions, informing others on how to care for mini beasts. e.g. 'How to care for a worm...' Don't forget to use your bossy verbs at the beginning of each instruction!</p> <p>Write a set of instructions on how to be a mini beast! E.g. 'How to be a spider'. Be creative!</p> <p>Try writing your instructions using a computer/iPad. You could use JIT (write), PowerPoint, word, paint etc. Insert some pictures of your mini beasts!</p>	<p>Money Use different combinations of money to pay for items to £1.</p> <p>Shape Can you draw lines of symmetry? Find some 2d shapes around the house, draw around them in your book and use a ruler to find the line of symmetry.</p> <p>Measuring If you find any mini beasts in your garden, can you measure them carefully?</p> <p>Recall the days of the week, months of the year and seasons - Can you write these words correctly? Think about something that happens in each month to help you remember.</p> <p>Keep practicing your times tables using J2 Blast on HWB - see if you can beat your time!</p>
<p>Reading Read some examples of instructions on how to make habitats for keeping mini beasts in the classroom/home. Identify the features of instructions. Use a dictionary to look up words that you are unsure.</p> <p>Use information books/ websites to find out how to care for mini beasts. Think of some questions to ask an adult.</p>	<p>Topic Make a map of where you went on your mini beast hunt. Plot the route you took and create a key to show features.</p> <p>Using JIT Chart, create a bar chart showing what mini beasts you found and how many of each there were. Don't forget to add a title to your work and save it using your name and date.</p>
<p>Oracy</p> <p>Look at the pictures collected from your mini beast hunt and describe the things you seen.
