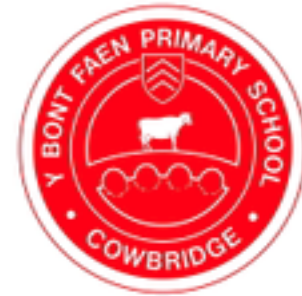

Half Term Reading Challenge Summer Term 2020

Since we have spent an increasing amount of time in our homes, some children and adults have found that they have been enjoying reading more than ever.

Over the half term we would like each child to share a photograph of them reading in an area of their home, either inside or outside. Children can choose their favourite type of reading material, for example a fact/fiction book, a magazine or even an e-book.

Children may want to choose an area that is special to them; their bedroom, a homemade den in the garden, relaxing on the sofa, hiding under the stairs.

The photographs will be collated by the class teacher into a short film and will be shared on our school website and within, either Seesaw or Google Classroom.

In addition the children can submit a caption that can be displayed with the photograph explaining either of the following:

- Why they enjoy reading.
- Why they enjoy reading the specific text.
- Why they enjoy reading in that place.

Please be aware that by submitting a photograph you are giving consent for the picture to be shared through the stated channels. We would like photographs and captions (optional) sent to the teachers via Seesaw or Google Classroom by Tuesday June 4th.

There is no obligation to take part in this activity, we thought it would be a nice way for the children to see their class friends again.
